This combined Residency-Research program in the Department of Pathology at the University of Pittsburgh Medical Center is designed to train **Academic Pathologists** to become independent **Principal Investigators**, playing a leading role in combined research and diagnostic careers. The program, which was initiated in 2005, is structured for efficient integration of full time research training with ACGME training.

Qualified applicants will apply through the Pathology Residency Program (<http://path.upmc.edu/brochure/residency.html>), demonstrating outstanding clinical and research qualifications with a strong commitment to an investigational academic career. The 4-6 year PI Residency track includes: 1) ACGME accredited training in Anatomic or Clinical Pathology, AP/CP, or primary certification plus fellowship (e.g. AP/NP, CP/MDx), 2) at least 1.5 yrs of protected research training, and 3) longitudinal guidance from a career advisory committee.
